OLD BUSINESS:

1. The Harbormaster reported he has received a bid for Adamson Industries, in Haverhill, to install new emergency lights lighting on the patrol boat. A motion was made, Mitchel/McLean, to accept the bid of \$4082.00 to install the new Light Bar. Passed by unanimous vote.
2. The purchaser pf Avanti To, Eric Stucker presented is plans for the vessel and requested a ten day extension on the requirement to move the vessel from town property. A motion was made to a approve the extension Mclean/Olson Approved by unanimous vote.
3. Rings Island Fire Station, Vice Chairman Santos reported no progress on this project.

4. The Harbormaster reports the new Pumpout boat is on schedule for a July 1, 2019 delivery.
5. Vice-Chairman Santos reported he has expended \$1200.00 of the \$2,400.00 authorized to purchase new chains shackles and other hardware for the moorings of the town floats. Thanks to a very favorable discount on chain and shackles received from Bridge Marina this project has been completed under budget.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. A motion was made to reorganize the Commission. By unanimous vote Mr. Chapman was reappointed chairman, Mr. Santos vice-chairman and Mr. Mitchel secretary.
2. No action has been taken, to date, by Boys and Girls Club to remove the sailboat, they have stored at the Friedenfels Rd. property.
3. Discussion took place regarding the clean-up of the Boat Storage Area on Friedenfels Rd. Harbormaster Pike and Commissioner McLean agreed to obtain quotes to accomplish the clean-up.

A. HARBORMASTER PROJECTS

B. SHELLFISH CONSTABLE PROJECT

- a. Request from Selectmen on status of recreational clamming on Blackwater River – not open due to old bacteria counts. I committed to take water samples this year and have them tested for bacteria counts and coordinate data with DMF Gloucester – Test 1 on 3/25 test results came back very positive
- b. \$150 set aside for FY 2018 testing, \$270 for FY 20 – Plan to start double lab submission in May
- c. 1 more water test sample set collected June 3 with 3 sites, 2 samples each site, 1 for state 1 for our lab
