ARTICLE ELEVEN

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$41,000.00 from Free Cash to FY2018 budget line item number 0100.0210.5850 (Police Department – Capital Outlay – Vehicles) for the purpose of purchasing and equipping a new cruiser for the Police Department, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE TWELVE

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$45,000.00 from Free Cash to FY2018 budget line item number 0100.0413.5830 (DPW – Capital Outlay - Infrastructure) for the purpose of purchasing all of the street lights in Salisbury from National Grid and maintaining said lights until the Town purchases and installs new LED street lighting throughout the Town, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$25,000.00 from Free Cash to FY 2018 Budget line item number 0100.0123.5305 (Town Manager – Consulting Fees) for the purposes of funding the costs of an appraiser and expert appraisal services relative to valuation of land and easements and the costs of acquiring said land and easements as may be necessary or appropriate to construct and use recreational trails in, on and under the parcels of land identified on Sheet No. 20 of a plan of land entitled "Plan and Profile of Salisbury-Multi-Use Trail Extension (Border to Boston Trail) in the Town of Salisbury Essex County Preliminary Right of Way" prepared for the Massachusetts Department of Transportation Highway Division dated March 16, 2018, and the parcels of land identified on Sheet No. 8 of a plan of land entitled "Plan and Profile of Trail Connector @ I-95 in the City/Town of Amesbury and Salisbury Essex County Preliminary Right of Way Plans" prepared for the Massachusetts Department of Transportation Highway Division dated March 7, 2018, copies of which are on file with the Town Clerk, as said plans may be amended; or to take any other action relative thereto.

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$15,000.00 from Free Cash to FY2018 budget line item number 0100.0123.5305.3030 (Town Manager – Broadway Mall Project) for the purpose of funding improvements to the Broadway Mall, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$30,000.00 from Free Cash to FY2018 budget line item number 0100.0413.5240 (DPW - Building Repair and Maintenance) for the purpose of re-paving sidewalks and making improvements to the façade of the former Memorial School, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ON PETITION OF THE TOWN MANAGER

ARTICLE SIXTEEN

To see if the Town will vote to amend the vote taken under Article 19 of the October 23, 2017 Annual Fall Town Meeting regarding funding the Town's share of a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers study of possible solutions for coastal erosion problems on Salisbury Beach, by changing the purpose for which said funds may be used, and to dedicate such funding to be used toward the Town's share of the cost of acquiring sand from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' dredging of the Piscataqua River for placement on or near Salisbury Beach, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE SEVENTEEN

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$45,000.00 from Water Enterprise Fund Retained Earnings to FY2018 budget line item number 7000.0450.5830 (Water Enterprise Fund – Capital Outlay – Infrastructure) for the purpose of funding the replacement of gate valves, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$55,000.00 from Water Enterprise Fund Retained Earnings to FY2018 budget line item number 7000.0450.5830 (Water Enterprise Fund – Capital Outlay – Infrastructure) for the purpose of funding the replacement of water hydrants, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE NINETEEN

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$250,000.00 from Water Enterprise Fund Retained Earnings to FY2018 budget line item number 7000.0450.5830 (Water Enterprise Fund – Capital Outlay – Infrastructure) for the purpose of funding the replacement of water mains, including all incidental or related costs; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ARTICLE TWENTY

To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$23,000.00 from Water Enterprise Fund Retained Earnings to FY2018 budget line item number 7000.0450.5278 (Water Enterprise Fund – Purchase of Services – Contracted Maintenance and Repairs) for the purpose of performing an inspection of the Batt Hill water tank; or to take any other action relative thereto.

ON PETITION OF THE TOWN MANAGER

ARTICLE TWENTY-ONE

To take any other action that may be lawfully taken at this meeting.

And you are hereby directed to serve this Warrant by posting attested copies in at least ten (10) public places in Town over two consecutive Sundays before the time of said meeting.
