ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE

The purpose of this bylaw is to promote the creation of new small ground-mounted solar photovoltaic installations.

ARTICLE XXIII

Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Installations Bylaw

300-144. Purpose

The purpose of this bylaw if to promote the creation of new small scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic installations by providing standards for placement, design, construction, and modification.

The provisions set forth in this section shall apply to the construction, operation, and modification of small ground mounted solar photovoltaic installations.

300-144.1 Applicability

The section applies to small scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic installations proposed to be constructed after the effective date of this section. This section also pertains to physical modifications that materially alter the type, configuration, or size of these installations or related equipment.

300-144.2 Definitions

BUFFER STRIP

A strip of land between the solar photovoltaic arrays, and any structures accessor thereto, and the boundary of the parcel, reserved for plant material, berms, walls, or fencing to serve as a visual barrier.

PLANT MATERIAL

Trees or shrubs of a type and height that sufficiently screen the arrays without blocking necessary sun that would hinder the product performance, including ground cover that would screen lower portions of the arrays.

SMALL SCALE GOUND-MOUNTED PHOTOVOLTAIC INSTALLATIONS

A solar photovoltaic system that is structurally mounted on the ground that occupies 2,100 square feet or less of surface area of solar panels.

ON-SITE PHOTOVOLTAIC INSTALLATION

A solar photovoltaic installation that is constructed at a location Where For the underlying property occur.

SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC ARRAY

An arrangement of solar photovoltaic panels.

300-145. General Requirements for all Small Scale Solar Power Generation Installations

The following requirements are common to all small solar photovoltaic installations to be sited in designated locations.

300-145.1 Compliance with Laws, Ordinance, and Regulations

The construction and operation of all small solar photovoltaic installations shall be consistent with all applicable local, state, and federal requirements, including but not limited to all applicable safety, construction, electrical, and communications requirements. All buildings and fixtures forming part of a small ground mounted solar photovoltaic installation shall be constructed in accordance with the State Building Code.

300-1452 Permitting Process

Small Scale Ground Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Solar Energy Installations

A. Building permit and inspection

No solar photovoltaic installation shall be constructed, installed or modified as provided in this section without first obtaining a building permit.

B. Fee

The application for a building permit for solar photovoltaic installations must be accompanied by the fee required for a building permit.

C. Permitting

Small scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic installations and energy installations require only a building permit, except that at small-scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic installation 20 feet in height or greater, at its maximum extension, shall require a special permit from the Planning Board. All other necessary permits shall be obtained before a building permit is issued.

300-146 Dimension and Density Requirements

Small Scale Ground Mounted Setbacks

The purpose of setbacks is to mitigate adverse impacts on abutting properties for small ground mounted solar photovoltaic installations, front, side, and rear setbacks shall be as follows:

a. Front yard setbacks for small ground mounted photovoltaic installation shall have a front yard setback no closer that the existing foundation of the primary dwelling to the front of the property line, except when the existing dwelling is more than 125 feet from the front property line or otherwise if determined appropriate by the Planning Board.

b. Side yard and rear yard setbacks for small scale ground mounted photovoltaic installation shall meet the side yard and rear yard setbacks as set forth in the Town of Salisbury Dimension Control Table.

c. Modifications of setbacks. The Planning Board may modify and change the setbacks and other locational requirements described under 300-146 for small scale ground mounted solar energy systems.
