## Question 1

Will the cost of police details be the responsibility of the Town or the Selected Offeror? If the latter, can the Town please provide estimated rates and/or anticipated quantities are required police details for this project?

## Answer 1

The street lights are new and we don't have or anticipate too many outages a year so I can't really say how often you might need a Police Detail. A lot of streets don't require one, typically only main roads. The detail rate is \$61 an hour with a four hour minimum then if the work exceeds four hours it jumps to eight hours.

Question 2

Page 5, Section 2.2 - Please clarify the definition of "timely services".

Answer 2

Typically, we require that the vendor come out twice a month if necessary to replace lights.

Question 3

Page 7, Section 3.2, second paragraph - Can the Town please provide an estimated "total expected value of the work"?

Answer 3

The line is referring to the limit under Mass General Law Chapter 30B and 30-39M which says that Municipalities must solicit three quotes for work estimated between \$10,000-50,000. For work estimated for more than that, Municipalities must use a sealed bid process. This is a quote process.

Question 4

Page 7, Section 3.3 - Can an excess/umbrella policy be combined to meet the required limits?

Answer 4

Yes, excess/umbrella can be combined to meet the limit

Question 5

Page 7, Section 3.3 – Can the Town consider removing this requirement?

Answer 5

No, the one selected for this project must do the work.

Question 6

Page 11, Section 4.6.A - Please clarify that this clause does not imply that the Selected Offeror will be liable for any utilities related to the work that are the responsibility of the utility.

## Answer 6

This section means that if you bring in a utility for some reason and they do something to damage property and the homeowner sued you, you would go after the utility or bring the in as a third party leaving the Town of out of it.
