To Become a Habitat Homeowner, Attend One of Our Informational Meeting *Two Informational Meetings Announced for October, 2019*

Lawrence, MA (July 19, 2019) – Merrimack Valley Habitat for Humanity (MVHH) is building two duplex homes in Salisbury, MA and we are looking for four qualifying households for these three-bedroom homes.

All members of the public are invited to attend one of our Homeowner Informational Meetings this October 2019 to obtain an application form. You will be required to complete the application form and return it to MVHH with all the required documentation.

To qualify as an MVHH homeowner, you must be a first-time homebuyer. All prospective MVHH homeowners will be required to partner with MVHH by volunteering 240-360 hours as “*sweat equity*.” Your household income must be within “*Targeted Income Guidelines*” as can be seen at the end of this press release. Additionally, applicants will be asked to document how their current housing is sub-standard, insecure, and too expensive for their monthly income.

Applicants who meet eligibility requirements will enter into a lottery and if chosen will become a prospective homeowner.

Both informational meetings will be held at the Salisbury Public Library, 1st-floor meeting room, located at 17 Elm Street, Salisbury, MA on:

- Saturday, October 5, 2019, at 10:30 AM
- Thursday, October 10, 2019, at 6:00 PM
