

#### **Planting Beachgrass**


- Guidelines for planting beachgrass:
  - O Plant beachgrass culms in staggered rows, 1-3 per hole, 8-10 inches deep and 12 inches apart to maximize sand capture and prevent wind tunnels.
  - o Firmly press sand around culms for stability, then widen row spacing to 18-24
    - inches moving toward the ocean, and 36 inches for the last rows.
  - Ensure all plants are planted landward of high-tide line and seasonal beach fluctuations.



- Beachgrass care guidelines
  - Newly planted culms may require watering in the first few months, especially with low rainfall, but avoid over-watering.
  - Beachgrass culms should be fertilized 30 days after planting. Split the fertilizer applications: one in spring (after April 1) and another in the late summer/early fall
  - Limit fertilizer to 1 pound of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet per application;
    reduce or apply only when stand weakens once established.

#### **Sand Fencing**

- Guidelines for installing sand fencing
  - o Install sandfence in 5' 15' sections using wooden slats (approx. 3/8" thick, 1 1/2" wide, 48" high), wire-connected, and supported by 2" to 4" diameter round wooden posts.
  - Ensure top of sand fence is higher than support posts; cut wooden posts at 45degree angle for stability.
  - The sand fence should be installed diagonally (northwest to southeast orientation) at a 45-degree angle and sections be spaced 25-50 feet apart except when bordering walking paths.
  - Sand fencing parallel to the shore is discouraged. Rope may be installed in lieu.



### **Beach Access Walkways**

- At-grade walks are usually no wider than 36 inches and must have well-marked alignment.
- Approach direction for at-grade access depends on site conditions; generally, it should be southeast at a 45-degree angle to the shore.
- When possible, use of existing public or shared access for multiple properties is encouraged.
